Background:

The following three structures have been identified by the County as needing improvement:

Bridge W-7: Green Avenue over Debbie's Creek

Structure W-8: Fisk Avenue Culvert between Debbie's Creek and The Glimmer Glass

Bridge W-9: Brielle Road Bridge over The Glimmer Glass

The project purpose, needs, and goals/objectives were developed by the project team and presented to various stakeholders and the general public in May 2016 for comment. The project purpose, needs, and goals/objectives served as a basis for the development and assessment of alternatives.

In November /December 2016, the Project Team held a Stakeholders meeting and a pair of Public Information Centers (PIC's), one in Manasquan and one in Brielle, to review the feasible improvement alternatives for each structure. Based on the feedback received, these alternatives were refined and then assessed against the project purpose, needs, and goals/objectives. The Project Team has reviewed these assessments and has selected a recommended Preliminary Preferred Alternative for each structure. The following alternatives were considered:
